# BUILDINGS, GROUNDS, & EQUIPMENT - Ron Gyure, Chair.

Ron Gyure is pleased with the new furnace and AC unit installed by Mack M. Darr. Jim Moore commented that the project was fully funded by an LV Endowment grant and the contractor has been paid in full.

2021 Mowing - Jim Moore says we will keep the mowing schedule the same as last year. Ron Gyure made a motion to advertise for bids and was seconded by Gwen Dellett. All in favor. Motion was passed. Bids will be opened at the April 20<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Rick Skovensky of PennDOT estimated our 2021 paving list at slightly over \$29,000.00. Rick has prepared a bid package for the Borough. Chuck O'Shell recommended that we do the entire list.

Jeff Rager made a motion to advertise for bids and was seconded by Chuck O'Shell. All in favor. Motion passed. Jim Moore will arrange to advertise for bids which requires two (2) ads to be run at least three (3) days apart. Bids will be opened at the April meeting.

Westmoreland County has informed us that our Ninth Street project for new storm drains was approved for \$191,000.00. The Borough is required to provide a 15% matching for the project. The money has not yest been received by the county. The Borough is required to get permission prior to any preliminary engineering to begin.

Jeff Rager called PennDOT regarding a feasibility study to reduce the speed limit from 35 mph to 25 mph through whole town.

Fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) Street catch basin and related piping need repairs. Compass quoted a price of \$4,200.00 for repairs. Jeff Rager made a motion to award the job to Compass and Chuck O'Shell seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion Passed.

Wheelchair lift/ramp at school building: Ron Gyure has received two (2) quotes so far. One from Access for \$13,200.00 and one from Laurel for \$10,960.00. Ron will continue to solicit quotes.
