## **ORDINANCE NO. 1 OF 2022**

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW FLORENCE, COUNTY OF WESTMORELAND AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, RESTRICTING THE USE OF A VEHICLE BRAKE RETARDER AND PROVIDING FORPENALTIES IN VIOLATION THEREOF

WHEREAS, the Borough of New Florence, desires to regulate the noise created by vehicles traveling through the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of New Florence is authorized pursuant to the Borough Code to regulate traffic, and further pursuant to regulations adopted by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, (PennDOT); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of New Florence has sought, and received approval from PennDOT for such restriction, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A";

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED, and it hereby is enacted and ordained, by the Council of the Borough of New Florence, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania:

**Section 1.** It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to use or permit the use of brake retarders on the following roadways:

**Section 2.** Any person, firm, operation, or organization violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon summary conviction be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$300.00 and costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, to undergo imprisonment for a period not in excess of 10 days.

Section 3. Pursuant to the regulations of PennDOT with respect to signs on highways, the Borough of New Florence shall cause to be erected upon the roadways herein specified, signs regarding the prohibition of the use of said engine retarders with improperly maintained, defective, or modified exhaust mufflers on the designated highways.

**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall be enforceable by any law enforcement agency having jurisdiction within New Florence Borough.

Section 5. All prior Ordinances in conflict with the provisions hereof are hereby repealed.
