NO. 155 of 1982

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ORDINANCE REGULATING PARKING WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF NEW FLORENCE, TO LIMIT PARKING IN FRONT OF THE POST OFFICE TO POSTAL PATRONS ONLY DURING POSTAL HOURS, AND PROVIDING FINES AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm, corporation or company to park on Ligonier Street along yellow painted curb in front of the New Florence Post Office during postal hours, unless they are utilizing the services or facilities of the New Florence Post Office while they are parked.

Section 2. Any person, persons, firm, corporation or company violating any provision of this Ordinance shall receive a ticket or citation assessing a \$5.00 fine. If the fine is not paid by the violator within forty-eight (48) hours of the issuance of the ticket at the New Florence Borough Police Office at Box 308, New Florence, Pennsylvania 15944, the owner shall, upon conviction thereof before the Magistrate of appropriate jurisdiction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars nor more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars.

- (a) The conditions of the agreement are set forth in the Declaration of Trust referred to in Section 1;
- (b) This municipality's participation in the Trust shall be terminable at any time by ordinance;
- (c) The Declaration of Trust and the purchase of its shares are for the purpose of investing this municipality's funds in obligations which are otherwise legal investments as part of a pooled arrangement with other governmental units, thereby achieving economic and other advantages of pooled investments;
- (d) It is not necessary to finance the agreement authorized herein from municipal funds except through the purchase of shares in the Trust;
- (e) The Trust shall be managed by a Board of Trustees as set forth in the Declaration of Trust and the By-Laws provided for therein; and
- (f) Shares may be purchased and redeemed from time to time as this municipality may determine to be necessary or appropriate to meet its cash investment requirements.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall become effective at the earliest date permitted by law.
